They will be linked with mentors for a period of six months and will cover subjects including: **Servant Leadership and Team-Building, Effective Communication and Public Speaking, Problem-Solving and Critical Thinking, Ethical Decision-Making and Integrity, Goal-Setting, Time Management and Project Planning.**

AE DRC continues to walk alongside vulnerable women who would love to support their families, using the skills they have recently acquired. Graduates of a recent sewing course in Maluku received certificates and were each presented with a sewing machine to give them a head start.
